Recycling bins


Placing recycling bins in convenient locations makes it easy for people to donate any time. Recycling will increase substantially as people no longer need to travel across town or adhere to donation hours. Our bins are approximately 4' x 4' x 6' and can be placed in parking spots, planters, or anywhere with good vsilbility.



We make it easy

We service bins weekly and keep surrounding areas clean. Your organization will be paid per pound of clothing collected- extra money for your programs simply for hosting a bin on your property. We will provide records to show the impact you have made through this program.







Where does it all go?

- All collections from the bins are sent to a sorting facility. The goal is to ensure that each piece is able to live out its full life cycle.
- Textiles in good condition are resold and put back into the economy via thrift and second hand stores.
- Anything that doesn't meet this quality level is broken down and used to make rags or to create fibers used for insulation in car seats, upholstery etc.



 Shoes received without pairs are taken apart and materials such as the leather are reused.
